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CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY

Pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) Section 91.109, the Department of Building and Safety is required to issue a Certificate of Occupancy for every building or structure (with exceptions where the occupancy of the original building permit has not changed, where Group A or E occupancies constructed prior to 1934 have not been discontinued for a period of more than six months, and where the architecture of the structure inhibits occupancy). Many lenders require a valid Certificate of Occupancy prior to a change in the ownership or prior to refinancing of a property. However, the past Los Angeles Municipal Codes did not require the Department of Building and Safety to issue a Certificate of Occupancy. As an example, prior to 1923 the Department of Building and Safety was not required to issue a Certificate of Occupancy for any building or structure, and prior to 1943, 1 and 2 family dwellings did not require issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy.
